#### **Lesson 6: Prayer with Balance**

#### **Lesson Summary**

Prayer is communion with the triune God, rooted in Scripture's pattern: to the Father, through the Son, by the Spirit (Matt. 6:9; John 14:6; Rom. 8:26). We pray to the Father as the One who hears and answers (1 John 5:14). We come in Jesus' name, trusting His mediating work and authority (John 16:23). We rely on the Spirit, who intercedes when we are weak and aligns our prayers with God's will (Rom. 8:26; John 16:13). Scripture also shows believers addressing Jesus (Acts 7:59; 2 Cor. 12:8) and seeking the Spirit's filling (Eph. 5:18). Thus, while the model is to pray to the Father, personal intimacy with Christ and the Spirit is biblical. Jesus is our Friend (John 15:13–15), Intercessor (Heb. 7:25), and ever-present Companion (Matt. 28:20; Eph. 3:17). Balanced prayer keeps reverence and intimacy together: honoring the Father, accessing through the Son, and depending on the Spirit.

7. **Q:** What balance should mark our prayers? **A:** Reverence for God's holiness with intimacy and boldness in Christ (Heb. 4:16).
