Lesson 6: Biblical Demonology - The Battle Against Darkness

Lesson Summary

Biblical demonology studies the origin, nature, activity, and destiny of demons—always interpreted through the lens of Scripture rather than superstition. Demons are fallen angels who rebelled with Satan (Rev. 12:4; Isa. 14:12–15; Ezek. 28:12–19).

They operate in the spiritual realm, influencing individuals, systems, ideologies, and cultures (Dan. 10:13; Eph. 6:12). In the Old Testament, Israel was warned not to sacrifice to demons (Deut. 32:17; Ps. 106:37).

In the New Testament, Jesus demonstrated supreme authority over them, casting out spirits and commissioning His disciples to do the same (Mark 5:1–20; Luke 10:19). Today, demons continue to deceive through false doctrines, occultism, and worldly ideologies (1 Tim. 4:1; 2 Cor. 11:13–15).

Yet believers share Christ's victory: He disarmed rulers and powers at the cross (Col. 2:15), and we are seated with Him in the heavenlies (Eph. 2:6). Believers overcome through the Word, prayer, faith, and the authority of Jesus' name.

Satan and his forces face certain judgment in the lake of fire (Rev. 20:10). Our battle is real, but the outcome is secure in Christ.
