Lesson 2: Hosting God's Presence

Lesson Summary

God desires to fill His people with His presence and glory (Eph. 3:19), yet our natural capacity cannot fully contain His divine fullness (Exod. 33:20; 1 Tim. 6:16). God's gracious solution is the indwelling Holy Spirit, given at salvation, making our bodies His temple (John 14:16–17; 1 Cor. 6:19).

The Holy Spirit enables us to understand God's mysteries (1 Cor. 2:10–14), transforming human weakness into Spirit-empowered boldness—seen in Peter's denial of Christ compared with his fearless preaching at Pentecost (Matt. 26:69–75; Acts 2:14–41).

Hosting God's presence requires intentional pursuit and spiritual discipline: worship (Ps. 22:3; John 4:23–24), immersion in the Word (Josh. 1:8), prayer (Phil. 4:6–7), holiness (1 Pet. 1:15–16), creating prayerful spaces (Matt. 6:6), and seeking His glory with hunger and faith (Matt. 5:6; Exod. 33:18).

God reveals His manifest presence to those who draw near in humility, obedience, unity, and bold expectation (Acts 2:1–4; James 4:8). Hosting His presence is not about earning His favor, but about cultivating a surrendered life that welcomes and reflects His glory.
