Lesson 6: Prayer with Balance

Lesson Summary

Prayer is communion with the triune God, rooted in the biblical pattern: to the Father, through the Son, and by the Spirit (Matt. 6:9; John 14:6; Rom. 8:26).

We pray to the Father, who hears and answers (1 John 5:14). We come in Jesus' name, trusting His mediating work and authority (John 16:23). We rely on the Spirit, who intercedes in our weakness and aligns our prayers with God's will (Rom. 8:26; John 16:13).

Scripture also shows believers addressing Jesus (Acts 7:59; 2 Cor. 12:8) and seeking the Spirit's filling (Eph. 5:18). Thus, while the biblical model directs prayer to the Father, personal intimacy with Christ and the Spirit remains fully biblical.

Jesus is our Friend (John 15:13–15), Intercessor (Heb. 7:25), and ever-present Companion (Matt. 28:20; Eph. 3:17). Balanced prayer holds reverence and intimacy together—honoring the Father, coming through the Son, and relying on the Spirit.
